#### **Parent Survey**

#### We want you to tell us what you think.



Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/ guardians think of our school. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents/caregivers/ guardians (previously known as the Parent Opinion Survey). It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school

climate, student behaviour, student engagement and experiences of remote and flexible learning. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. Approximately 30 per cent of parents have been invited to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year, the Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 19<sup>th</sup> July** to <u>Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> September</u>. 85 Letters with details were sent home last week with students. To date three parents have completed the survey. Thank you.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (Hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

#### School Review

#### **School Review**

Currently we are preparing for our School Review which will be held in Term 4. One of the key stages is the prereview self-evaluation which is completed the term before. This is a collaborative process which aims to engage the whole school community in a reflective analysis of the school's performances and practices, including:

The celebration of highlights leading to improved student outcomes

A collective view of the school's performance against the School's Strategic Plan including enablers and barriers An assessment of the school's practices against the Framework for Improving Student Outcomes Continua.

#### We will be in contact in the coming weeks about opportunities to participate in this process.



**Facilities**: Over the school holidays the pool walls were repainted and the carpet was replaced with non-slip cement. The finishing touch was the application of this mural. This work was funded through a Minor Works Grant which we applied for in 2020. We have just submitted a new grant application for a covered area for our Basketball Court. The pool filter has just been upgraded and repairs are in process for the Air Change Filter. Thank you to Cathie Toma for coordinating the works at the pool.

**COVID Update**: Please see the letter from the Department within this newsletter about eligibility for vaccinations. Please see the advice below which was received on Wednesday 11 August:

#### Regional Victoria

There is no change to settings for regional Victoria, and schools in regional Victoria will continue with face-to-face learning.

#### **Cross-border community changes**

Residents of the cross-border community local government areas will now be required to obtain a permit to cross between Victoria and NSW from 6pm, Friday 13 August and must have an approved reason to travel.

If they have a permit, staff and students from the Cross Border Community Area can still cross the Victorian-NSW border for the purposes of work or education (which includes childcare or early childhood services as well as universities and TAFEs etc).

The full list of reasons Cross Border Community Area residents can cross the Victorian-NSW border includes:

- Necessary goods and services, including medical care
- Care or other compassionate reasons
- Work (whether paid or voluntary, including for charitable or religious purposes)
- Education (including childcare or early childhood services as well as higher education and TAFE etc)
- Receiving a COVID-19 vaccination

Organised/community sport and exercise connected to or organised by a club or facility.

Residents will be able to apply for a permit from Thursday afternoon at the <u>Service Victoria website</u> and via the Service Victoria app.

Dear parents and carers,

As part of the phased COVID-19 vaccination rollout, more Victorian school students are now eligible to receive the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine.

From Monday 9 August, children aged between 12 to 15 years old are eligible to receive a Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine if they:

identify as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander

have a specified <u>medical condition</u>.

People aged 16 years and older continue to also be eligible under these categories, to get a COVID-19 vaccine.

The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation will provide further advice on the broader 12-to-15-year age group in coming months. As more COVID-19 vaccine doses become available more people will be able to get vaccinated.

The free and safe vaccines being used in Australia are very effective at preventing serious illness and loss of life from COVID-19.

Eligible young people and their parents or guardians should speak to their doctor if they have questions about the COVID-19 vaccine and their health.

Booking an appointment

To book an appointment, visit the <u>coronavirus.vic.gov.au</u> website.

Eligible young people are encouraged to get their COVID-19 vaccine at their doctor's clinic or health care provider. They can also be vaccinated at Victoria's vaccination centres.

What to bring:

Bring a Medicare card (if you have one) that lists your child's name, and information about your child's medical history if they have an underlying medical condition. Please refer to Department Health information on what to bring to your vaccine appointment.




#### **UPPER PRIMARY YEARS' NEWS**

#### What I did in Lockdown


I stayed home and watched some Numeracy videos on YouTube,

#### **CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSION FUNDS (CSEF)**

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) commenced in 2015.

Families holding a valid means-tested concession card (Centrelink Card/Health Care Card) or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply for CSEF. \$125 per year is paid for eligible primary school students, and \$225 per year is paid for eligible secondary school students. A special consideration eligibility category also exists. Payments are made directly to the school.

#### **MEDICAL**

At Mildura Specialist School we have children who are at risk of an anaphylactic reaction to **nuts** in the school. Please be mindful of this when preparing your child's lunch or snacks.



#### **HEADLICE**

As a school community, we share the responsibility to control and manage head lice infections. Head lice have been around for many thousands of years and cannot be eradicated. Supporting each other to minimize their spread is vital.

It is important to check your child's head regularly with conditioner and comb even when you don't think your child has head lice.


#### **MEDICATION**
